

Note: All officials, including all managers, coaches, scorekeepers, umpires, tournament directors, district administrators, etc., should make every effort to prevent a situation that may result in the forfeiture of a game or suspension of tournament privileges. However, failure by any party to prevent such situations shall not affect the validity of a protest.

### WHAT DO I DO...

#### **Before Game**

### At least 30 minutes before game:

- Determine who will Pitch Count/Scoreboard & who will keep the book
- Fill out book with line-up
- Fill out pitch count log and pitching affidavit with starting pitcher and catcher

### **During Game**

Keep accurate records

#### After Game

- Wait for Pitching Affidavit to be initialed by managers
- Write in final scores in scorebooks

# Scorekeeping Important Notes for Tracking

- Late Players (Arrival is after line-up is turned into Umpire):
  - Up to the discretion of Manager if will have them play
  - Must be added to bottom of line-up for continuous batting order
  - Entered as potential substitute for Senior Divisions
- Sick / Injured players
  - Skip player in continuous batting order with no penalties. May reenter the game to the discretion of the Manager/Player.
  - (Seniors) Eligible substitute replaces. If nobody is eligible, opposing manager selects from current benched players.

### Ejected players

- Skip player in continuous batting order with no penalties.
- (Seniors) Eligible substitute replaces. If nobody is eligible, opposing manager selects from current benched players.

### **BATTERS**

### Scorekeeping Important Notes for Tracking

### Verbal Intentional Walk

Only Once per Batter per Game

### Seniors (Non-continuous batting order)

- If change is made during defense, manager must declare where in line-up batter goes.
- \*May not change position in batting line-up for a player
- Starter may only re-enter game once
- \*Substitutes, once removed, may not return

\*Illness/Injury may allow the two above conditions to change



# BASE RUNNERS Scorekeeping Important Notes for Tracking

### Continuous Batting Order

### Courtesy Runner (7.14(b) or TR 3(d)

- May be used for Pitcher/Catcher when there are 2 outs
- Must be player who made last out
  - If a pitcher or catcher made the last out, that player is still the courtesy runner

### Replace ill/injured runner

Player who made last out must replace ill/injured base runner

### Seniors (Non-continuous batting order)

### Special Pinch Runner (7.14(a) or TR 3(d) Seniors) may be used

- Not more than 1 time per inning, Not more than 2 times per game
- Player may only be SPR once per game
- SPR must be someone on the bench at time of change

### Replace ill/injured player

- Must be replace by a substitute
- Eligible substitute replaces. If nobody is eligible, opposing manager selects from current benched players.

### MANDATORY PLAY

#### Baseball and Softball

- Juniors and below:
  - Must play with a continuous batting order
- Seniors
  - No mandatory play
  - No continuous batting order

#### NOT PROTESTABLE

Judgement Calls
Unannounced Substitution

Missed Bases

The misapplication of a playing rule is also a protestable offense. However, this is typically outside the purview of the scorekeeper.



# **COUNTING PITCHES**

This reflects 3 pitches to first batter.

4 Pitches to second batter.

If pitcher is removed right now, Threshold pitches is 4, total pitches is 7.



#### **Reminder:**

Every pitch is counted, including

- All Fouls
- Illegal pitches (Pitched or Not Pitched)
- Balks with a delivered pitch,
- Balls in an intentional walk.
  - If umpire calls, "No Pitch", then do **not** count a pitch.

Space to track Visit to Mound if Umpire calls it out

Umpire calls, Strike - Batter out of box - Strike on batter, no pitch counted on pitcher (Rule 3.a)

GRD	Ground Rule Double	Ball bounces over outfield wall, batter given second base	
BB	Base on balls	Batter is walked	
HP or HBP	Hit by pitch	Batter is given first base due to being hit by a pitch	
FC	Fielder's choice	Batter gets on base, but another runner is out – could have been the batter being out (but the fielder "chose" to make another out)	
E#	Error	Fielder makes an error so batter gets on base (E3 = error made by first base)	
IBB	Intentional base on balls	Batter is walked intentionally	
CI	Catcher interference	Catcher's mitt interferes with bat swing, batter given first base	
K E2	Dropped 3 <sup>rd</sup> strike, runner safe at first	Third strike pitch, but the catcher drops it. In Majors, batter can run to base if 1) 1 <sup>st</sup> base is unoccupied, or 2) 1 <sup>st</sup> base is occupied and there are 2 outs	
#	Runner advanced by batter	Record jersey number of batter on base path for the base runner in the scorebook	
SB	Stolen base	Legitimate stolen base (not WP or PB or error)	
WP	Wild pitch	Pitcher's fault – catcher would have difficulties catching the ball, so a runner successfully gets to next base during another's at bat	
PB	Passed ball	Catcher's fualt – pitch was thrown so catcher should have caught the ball, but missed, so a runner successfully gets to next base during another's at bat	
BK	Balk	Pitcher makes illegal motion after coming to a set with a runner on base


Standard scoring when multiple players make an out working together:


Place the position numbers of those who helped make the out in the sequence that the out was made (i.e., 9-6-3 = right fielder throws to shortstop who throws to 1<sup>st</sup> base player who gets the out).



Batting Out of Turn



### Scorekeeper may not alert anyone of batting out of turn.

- 1. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. If fixed while Sam is batting, Palmer takes Sam's place with the count Sam incurred.
- 2. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. Team appeals after Sam completes at bat but **before** next pitch is thrown:
  - Palmer is out and Sam is removed from base.
  - Any players advanced on ball batted in play, are put back to spot of last pitch.
  - Next batter after Palmer is proper batter, which might be Sam.
- 3. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. Team appeals after Sam completes at bat *and after* next pitch is thrown (or no appeal):
  - Batter after Sam is proper batter.
  - This might skip people in the lineup.



Scenario One:

Sam comes up to bat, realize mistake and put Palmer in batter's box.

Palmer takes the count Sam left off with.
