## Scorekeepers and Pitch Counters Responsibilities

## Tournament Scorekeepers Clinic

## From Rule Book

Note: All officials, including all managers, coaches, scorekeepers, umpires, tournament directors, district administrators, etc., should make every effort to prevent a situation that may result in the forfeiture of a game or suspension of tournament privileges. However, failure by any party to prevent such situations shall not affect the validity of a protest.

## IMPORTANT NOTES

## Scorekeeping important notes

Softball:

- Limit of no more than 5 pitchers in a game is removed for tournament Juniors and below:
- Continuous batting order, no offensive substitutions allowed
- Track order of "outs" in order to know who the last out was to apply courtesy runners.
- Track pitcher and, for baseball, catchers for defensive positions throughout the game

Seniors:

- No mandatory play requirements
- Special pinch runner is allowed, curtesy runners not allowed
- Designated hitter is allowed
- Players are married to their batting order, substitutes once removed may not reenter

All Divisions:

- Verbal international walk: A player may only be verbally intentionally walked once per game, meaning, once that player has been verbally internally walked, they must be pitched to for the reminder of that game.


## LINE UPS

League

## Scorekeeping Important Notes for Line Ups

- Managers may make changes to the line up given to a scorekeeper up until the line-ups are given to plate umpire.
- Once given to plate umpire this is the official line up
- Once official, ALL changes must be given directly to the umpire, umpire communicates to scorekeeper


## JUNIORS AND BELOW

Scorekeeping Important Notes for Tracking

## Continuous Batting Order Required

- Late Players:
- Up to the discretion of Manager if will have them play
- Must be added to bottom of line-up for continuous batting order
- Must still meet mandatory play requirement of one at bat
- Sick / Injured players
- Skip player in continuous batting order with no penalties. May reenter the game to the discretion of the Manager/Player.
- Ejected players
- Skip player in continuous batting order with no penalties.


## Curtesy Runners

- Pitcher / Catcher must complete an At Bat mandatory play requirement before curtesy runners may be used.


## SENIORS

9 players in batting order (10 in line up if using designated hitter)

- Designated hitter must be identified at start of game.
- No mandatory play requirements.
- Except for purposes of injury or illness requirements, substitutes once removed may not reenter the game.
- If substitute is coming in during defense, manager must announce where in the batting order that substitute is playing during the defensive change.
- If there are no eligible subs (player has not yet played in the game) to replace an injured/ill player, opposing team selects someone on the bench to substitute.
- If there are only starters "on the bench" when an injury/illness happens, the starters may come off the bench to replace the injured / ill player.


## TEAM RESPONSIBILITY

## Pregame

- Know who is going to be in the score booth.
- Person should be prepared to either perform as pitch counter or scorekeeper
- Make sure this person knows they need to be at game site 45 minutes before game.


## Game

- Keep fans away from score booth
- Treat those in score booth with respect
- Manager or Coach may ask for pitch count, otherwise interactions should be with Umpire


## Post Game

- Coaches handle team and equipment to leave playing site.
- Manager immediately following game, go to score booth to sign pitching affidavit.


## SCOREKEEPER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

## Pregame

- In the score booth 45 minutes before game
- Check Scoreboard Operation
- Note all ineligible pitchers
- 30 minutes before game, get lineups from
managers
- Enter information in book
- Uniform Number
- Full First Name and Last Name
- Starting Defense Position


## Game

- Record all pitcher changes
- Record all catcher changes (baseball only)
- Record all substitutions (Seniors Only)
- Record all game plays
- Trips to the mound per pitcher/per inning
- Special Pitch Runner (Seniors Only)
- Verbal Intentional Walks, only one per batter
- Last out for courtesy runner availability (Non Senior Only)


## Post Game

- Complete book and clearly show final score


## SCOREKEEPERS

Scorekeepers and other tournament officials are required to take action to avoid a protest.

On the other hand, scorekeepers and other tournament officials are prohibited from providing information to anyone that would give one team an unfair advantage over the other.

As a scorekeeper, it is important that you are familiar with what is protestable and should be mentioned and what is not protestable and should be quietly kept to yourself.

## PROTESTABLE

Mandatory Play Violations Improper Substitution Illegal Pitcher Illegal Catcher Illegal Player

## NOT PROTESTABLE

Judgement Calls<br>Unannounced Substitution Batting Out of Turn Runner not Tagging Up Runner Leaving Early Missed Bases

The misapplication of a playing rule is also a protestable offense. However, this is typically outside the purview of the scorekeeper.

## SEE SOMETHING / SAY SOMETHING? BATTING OUT OF TURN

Pat is due up to bat now and has met mandatory play. Blake, however, goes into the batter's box. Do you say something?

- If Pat has already met mandatory play of one at bat, scorekeeper may assume that Pat is either sick/injured or team is batting out of turn, in which case Do Not say something.

Pat is due up to bat now and has not met mandatory play. Blake, however, goes into the batter's box. Do you say something?

- Do not interrupt the game but immediately let the tournament director that this player was skipped and has not yet received mandatory play.


## SEE SOMETHING / SAY SOMETHING? <br> CURTESY RUNNER (JUNIORS AND BELOW)

Pitcher and/or Catcher has not met mandatory play.

- Has not completed an at bat yet
- First time up to bat
- Batted but did not take the batting position with no count (I.e. went into the batter's box with one strike on the count)
- Batted but was ill/injured while base runner so another player became the runner for them
If there are two outs and the team attempts to give that pitcher and/or catcher a curtesy runner:
- Call out to the Umpire and tell them that the player has not met mandatory play. Do not allow for the curtesy runner to be entered into the game. Get a tournament director if needed.


## NOTATING MANDATORY PLAY JUNIORS AND BELOW

As long as you have a consistent way to quickly see if someone has met mandatory play (and if another scorekeeper has to take over, they can also easily see this), this will help prevent any protests.

Make a notation next to the player's name, can be as simple as a star


Can also write it down on the blank lines, etc.

## Pregame

- Arrive 45 minutes before game
- Check Scoreboard Operation
- Note all ineligible pitchers
- 30 minutes before game, get lineups from managers
- Enter information in pitching affidavit and pitching log
- Uniform Number
- Full First Name and Last Name
- League Age (Baseball)


## Game

- Record all pitching changes
- Baseball
- Record all pitches
- All Foul Balls count as a pitch
- Balk on delivered pitch, counts as a pitch
- Illegal pitch counts as a pitch
- Verbal Intentional Walks, record all "Balls" (i.e. 4 pitches)
- Only if Umpire calls No Pitch, does a pitch not count
- Softball
- Log innings pitched


## Post Game

- Complete Pitch count affidavit
- Announce to managers to come up and sign pitcher affidavits
- Sign your initials

1. Write in Catcher(s) Uniform \# each inning.

$\checkmark$ New Pitcher: pitcher uniform number, name, league age, maximum pitches, inning entered.

## PITCHING LOG

## Pitching Log Baseball, Fill out in Pencil



- \# 12 started the game.
- In the third inning, \#9 starts pitching
- Score was 5-4, pitching team has 5 runs.
- \#12 started their last batter with:
- $1^{\text {st }}$ pitch is $39^{\text {th }}$ pitch, last pitch thrown to batter was 42 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$ pitch.

This allows for you to stay on one form throughout the game yet still capture everything you need to fill out the pitching affidavit after the game is over.

## COUNTING PITCHES

All methods are acceptable for tracking pitches. The key is knowing the first pitch to each batter. All methods is reflecting 3 pitches to first batter, 4 pitches to second batter.




## Reminder:

Every pitch is counted, including all fouls, illegal pitches, balks with a delivered pitch, balls in an intentional walk. If umpire calls, "No Pitch", then do not count a pitch.
Batter steps out of box - Strike on batter, no pitch counted on pitcher (Rule 3.a)

## SECOND GAME IN DAY - PITCHERS

You will continue the log from the previous game.

- I.e. - If that pitcher stopped pitching at 15 total pitches (regardless of a threshold), the next pitch that pitcher pitches, will count at 16 pitches for that day.
Ineligible to pitch second game:
- Intermediate division and below players who pitched in first game
- League age 12 playing Juniors/Seniors who pitched in first game
- Caught 4 or more innings in first game
- Senior/Junior - Pitcher reaches threshold of 31 or more pitches in first game


## SECOND GAME IN DAY - CATCHERS

- Player who pitched 41 or more threshold pitches in first game
- Catcher who moved to pitcher, then pitched:
- Juniors and below: 21 or more threshold pitches
- Seniors: 31 or more threshold pitches

- Score of game when pitchers were changed

## MANDATORY PLAY

## All Stars and TOC

Senior Division

- There is no mandatory play requirement for rostered players

Junior Divisions and Below

- Consecutive Batting Order
- No mandatory defensive play requirements

Managers are solely responsible for ensuring that all players fulfill the requirements of mandatory play, even if notification is not made.

## MANDATORY PLAY

## An AT-BAT, for the purposes of meeting the requirements of Mandatory Play

- Player assumes the position of a batter with no count and one of the following occurs:
- Player is retired as a batter, or
- Player is retired as a batter-runner, a runner or
- Player reaches base and scores, or
- After reaching base safely, the inning or game ends


## PITCHER / CATCHER MUST COMPLETE MANDATORY PLAY BEFORE A CURTESY RUNNER MAY BE USED.

Ways to Get on Base and Advance Baserunners

| Abbrev | Meaning | Example |

| 1B | Single | Batter is safe on first with a hit |
| 2B | Double | Batter is safe on second with a hit |
| 3B | Triple | Batter is safe on third with a hit |
| HR | Home run | Can also be a grand slam with 4 RBIs |
| GRD | Ground Rule Double | Ball bounces over outfield wall, batter given second base |
| BB | Base on balls | Batter is walked |
| $\begin{aligned} & \text { HP } \\ & \text { or HBP } \end{aligned}$ | Hit by pitch | Batter is given first base due to being hit by a pitch |
| FC | Fielder's choice | Batter gets on base, but another runner is out could have been the batter being out (but the fielder "chose" to make another out) |
| E \# | Error | Fielder makes an error so batter gets on base (E3 = error made by first base) |
| IBB | Intentional base on balls | Batter is walked intentionally |
| Cl | Catcher interference | Catcher's mitt interferes with bat swing, batter given first base |
| K E2 | Dropped $3^{\text {ra }}$ strike, runner safe at first | Third strike pitch, but the catcher drops it. In Majors, batter can run to base if 1 ) $1^{5 t}$ base is unoccupied, or 2 ) $1^{3 t}$ base is occupied and there are 2 outs |
| \# | Runner advanced by batter | Record jersey number of batter on base path for the base runner in the scorebook |
| SB | Stolen base | Legitimate stolen base (not WP or PB or error) |
| WP | Wild pitch | Pitcher's fault - catcher would have difficulties catching the ball, so a runner successfully gets to next base during another's at bat |
| PB | Passed ball | Catcher's fualt - pitch was thrown so catcher should have caught the ball, but missed, so a runner successfully gets to next base during another's at bat |
| BK | Balk | Pitcher makes illegal motion after coming to a set with a runner on base |

Ways to Get Out
Standard scoring when multiple players make an out working together:
lace the position numbers of those who helped make the out in the sequence that the out was made (i.e., $9-6-3=$ right fielder throws to shortstop who throws to $1^{\text {st }}$ base player who gets the out)

## VISITS - BASEBALL \& SOFTBALL

Offensive Visits

- 1 Per inning

If defensive manager makes changes without talking to any defensive players, this will not count as a "visit".
Defensive Visits
8-9-10 Division

- $3^{\text {rd }}$ visit in inning, replace pitcher
- $4^{\text {th }}$ visit per game, replace pitcher

All Other Divisions

- $\quad 2^{\text {nd }}$ visit in inning, replace pitcher
- $3^{\text {rd }}$ visit per game, replace pitcher

When one team has been granted a "timeout" the opposing manager may confer with his/her team, provided they do not delay the game in any way.

NOTE: Intermediate and above, since pitchers can be moved defensively and come back as a pitcher,
Important to track all visits for that pitcher through the game.

## DEFENSIVE VISITS

Any visit (except injury) on defense is a "trip to the mound". If manager calls time, talks to right fielder, that counts as a trip for that inning and for that pitcher. Can log trips:

Towards the bottom of your score page, you can write "Trip" in the proper inning

## PITCHING RULES - SOFTBALL

## Little Leage and Below

- One day rest is required before first TOC game
- Less than 7 innings - No rest is required
- 7 or more innings -1 day rest is required
- Can not pitch in more than 12 innings in a day
- Can return to pitch at anytime, but only once in the same inning as removed, provided the pitcher was not removed from the game.


## Junior/Senior

- There are no restrictions, limits, or days rest
- Can be removed from the game and reenter as pitcher for that inning, and can only reenter once
- Pitcher remaining in the game, may return at any time, but only once in the same inning as removed

> Suspended games resumed the following calendar day: The pitchers of record at the time the game was halted may continue to pitch to the extent of the remaining eligibility that pitcher would have had during the previous day. However, in no event shall any pitcher pitch more than twelve (12) innings in any game.

## PITCHING RULES - BASEBALL

## Threshold

If a pitcher reaches a day(s) of rest threshold while facing a batter, the pitcher may continue to pitch until:

- The batter reaches base
- The batter is retired
- Third out is made to complete the half inning or the game
- The pitcher is removed from the mound prior to the batter completing his/her at bat.

The pitcher will only be required to observe the calendar day(s) rest of the threshold he/she reached during that at-bat, provided that pitcher is removed, or the game is completed before delivering a pitch to another batter.

## BASEBALL DAILY LIMITS

Daily Game Limits for Pitchers (Threshold Applies)


More than 30, one game only
30 or less in Game 1, may pitch in another game that day
$\qquad$

Threshold applies to determine the count

Under no circumstances shall a player pitch in three (3) consecutive days.
A game suspended, does count towards pitching a day.

## PITCHING RULES - BASEBALL

Pitchers, once removed from the mound:

- Little League and Below - May not return
- Intermediate/Junior/Senior - A pitcher remaining in the game, but moving to a different position, can return as a pitcher anytime in the remainder of the game, but only once per game.


## PITCHER TO CATCHER

## Pitcher to Catcher- Regulation VI - Pitchers (Baseball)

| 41 or more pitches may not catch for remainder of the Day <br> (Threshold applies) | Pitcher starts batter, first pitch is the $40^{\text {th }}$ pitch. <br> Pitcher completes the batter at 45 pitches. <br> Yes, may become catcher |

## Upon Suspension of Game

- Clearly note where offensive players are
- Line Up accurately reflects batting order
- Make sure Balls/Strikes on batter are clearly noted
- Make sure Pitching affidavit is accurate


## Resume Game

- Same Batter up to Bat with same balls/strikes
- Same batting orders
- Same defensive players (or legal substitute)
- Check pitcher affidavit for eligibility


## SUSPENDED GAME - BASEBALL

## Game resumes next calendar day

20 or less pitches
Seniors: 30 or less

- Pitch count begins at

## Pitcher has not pitched in other games

## SCORING BATTING OUT OF TURN

Scorekeeper may not alert anyone of batting out of turn.

1. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. If fixed while Sam is batting,

2. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. Team protests after Sam completes at bat but before next pitch is thrown:

Palmer is out and Sam is removed from base.
Any players advanced on ball batted in play, are put back to spot of last pitch. Next batter after Palmer is proper batter, which might be Sam.
3. Batter "Sam" bats when "Palmer" should be up. Team protests after Sam completes at bat and after next pitch is thrown (or no protest):

Batter after Sam is proper batter.
This might skip people in the lineup.

## SUBSTITUTIONS/RE-ENTRY

League

All changes will be reported directly to the plate umpire. Do not receive changes directly from manager. The plate umpire will record the changes and then announce those changes to the scorekeeper and opposing manager.


When Nila Ayda reenters the game, Nila must enter the \#7 batting spot.

Nila may reenter the game in any legal defensive position (i.e. could reenter as $2^{\text {nd }}$ baseman, shortstop, etc.).

All players are "married" to their batting order, once entered onto that spot in the line-up, may not be put in another place in the batting order.

Note: Unless there are injuries with no substitutes available.

## DESIGNATED HITTER SENIOR LEAGUE

- Must be identified at start of game
- Designated Hitter (Position of DH)
- Designee Defense Player ( $10^{\text {th }}$ spot on line-up)
- Designated hitter may not be put in any other spot in the lineup when substituting
- Designated hitter player and designated defense position player may not be on defense at the same time.


A designated hitter can be for any one defensive player. The player listed in the $10^{\text {th }}$ spot in the line-up is the person being designated hit for.

- If the batter in the DH position, plays defense, you lose the designated hitter and the player in the $10^{\text {th }}$ spot in the lineup goes onto the bench.
- If the team wants the player in the $10^{\text {th }}$ spot in the line-up to bat, you lose the designated hitter, and that player must enter the game in the DH batting order spot, the person who was the designated hitter goes on the bench.


## Examples:

1. Ivan can sub for Anne as a catcher but can't bat to keep DH.

17 "Leonard Oswald
23 Ivan Gerhold
2. Ivan can sub for Isaac but not play defense to keep DH.
3. Ivan can sub for Isaac, remove Anne from the game, Ivan can play defense and lose DH.

## Special Pinch Runner Seniors Only

## SPECIAL PINCH RUNNER

Twice a game but not more than one time per inning, a team may utilize a player who is not in the batting order as a special pinch-runner for any offensive player.

- A player may only be removed for a special pinch-runner one time during a game.
- The player for whom the pinch-runner runs is not subject to removal from the lineup.
- Courtesy runners are not allowed.

The goal is to easily see an inning that already had a SPR (7.14) and a Player that already had a SPR.

## Playing Rules and Penalties Appendix

## PLAYING RULES

## Foul Ball versus Foul Tip

A foul tip is a batted ball that goes sharp and direct from the bat to the catcher's hands and is legally caught.

- This is a strike and the ball is live

A foul ball is a batted ball that does not go straight to the catcher but is in foul territory.

- If a fly ball and caught, ball is live and runners may advance/batter is out
- If not caught, ball is dead
- Counts as strike if less than 2 strikes on batter
- Still adds to pitch count even if no strikes can be recorded


## Infield Fly

With runners on $1^{\text {st/ }} 2^{\text {nd }}$ base (or bases loaded) with less than 2 outs and fly ball easily caught by infielder (Shortstop counts as infielder).

- Batter is out
- Runners may advance at own risk but no "Force" is in effect


## PLAYING RULES

## Illegal Bats

The penalty for use of an illegal bat, if discovered before the next player enters the batter's box following the turn at bat of the player who used the illegal bat is:

- The batter is out ( NOTE: The manager of the defense may advise the plate umpire of a decision to decline this portion of the penalty and accept the play. Such election shall be made immediately at the end of the play), and;
- The manager of the team will be ejected from the game, the batter who violated the rule will be ejected from the game, and the offensive team will lose one eligible adult base coach for the duration of the game.


## PLAYING RULES

## One Foot in Batter's Box

## Penalty

- The umpire shall warn the batter. After one warning on a batter, the umpire shall call a strike. No pitch has to be thrown
- Little League and below: The ball is dead. No runners may advance and does not count in pitch count.
- Intermediate/Junior/Senior Divisions: The ball is live and does not count in pitch count.
- See Tournament Rule 3(a) for complete wording
